Conditions for Use

Groups using YMCA Camp High Harbour must agree to the following:

1. Clean Up Responsibilities

The Camp Staff will be responsible for preparing the cabins for your arrival.

If there are any problems with the cabins, please see your Retreat Director.

Upon departure, someone from your group will need to go through the cabins your group occupied to make sure the following tasks have been completed:

- Remove all trash from the cabin and consolidate into one large bag.

- Sweep the bathrooms and the cabin area.

- Collect any lost and found items your group may have left behind

2. Damages:

Damages that occur during your retreat weekend will be reviewed with you and billed to your organization.

Damages are defined as anything that is beyond normal use. Graffiti is considered vandalism and groups responsible will be billed a minimum of \$150, per incident.

3. Camp Safety Procedures:

Each Retreat will begin with an introduction from the Retreat Director. The Director will give instructions and camp safety procedures in regards to the operation of camp.

- No camper or adult is allowed on the floating docks or boats unless a lifeguard is on duty.
- No throwing rocks.
- No running on board walks.
- No hiking without a buddy.

4. Equipment That Is Not Allowed:

Alcohol, drugs, animals and weapons of any kind.

5. Supervision:

All activities that utilize camp equipment may only be used under the direct supervision of camp staff members. All water based activities require lifeguard supervision. Each group must provide their own chaperones. Chaperones are responsible for the retreat participants at all times. Participants should never be left unsupervised in program areas or in the cabins.

6. Insurance:

Each group must submit a current Certificate of Insurance showing YMCA Camp High Harbour as additional insured.

Reservations, Deposits and Payments

Reservations

All groups require a minimum of 100 participants. If your group has less than 100 you are responsible to pay for 100 at the current rate.

Deposit

A nonrefundable deposit of 10% of the estimated retreat total must be paid within three weeks of the contract issue date.

In the event that a retreat is canceled, the deposit will be forfeited. For cancellations inside of 90 days please see our cancellation policy.

Payments

Checks, money orders, or credit cards are accepted ways for making payments. Please make checks and money orders payable to YMCA Camp High Harbour.

Payment schedule is as follows:

Upon contract agreement-10% of total balance is due (10% paid)
90 Days prior to event - 15% of total balance is due (25% paid)
60 Days prior to event - 25% of total balance is due (50% paid)
30 Days prior to event - 25% of total balance is due (75% paid)
Date of Event - 25% of total balance is due (100% paid)

4. Changes - Because YMCA Camp High Harbour must order food and supplies in advance, any changes to the number of guests must be made at least one week prior to your arrival date. Any unscheduled or late changes will result in your group being charged for either the contracted number of guests or the actual number of guests, whichever is greater.

Bid Requirement #3 states: "Bidders must have available a temporary preregistration flyer with a mailing address."

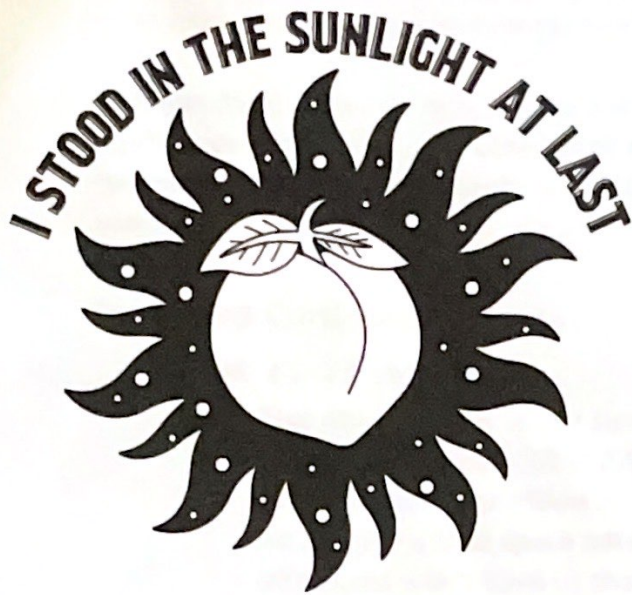

Bid Requirement #4 provides this guidance: "Whenever possible, provide that no large scale AA activity will be held in their city within a 30 day period before and a 30 day period after the conference date."

As these dates are so far out, it is hard to really determine whether the conference will conflict with other large scale AA events. However, we plan on coordinating around other conferences/prepaid/service assemblies in order to avoid this.

Proposed Conference Dates

- June 21-23 of 2019

- This date is earlier in the summer than the last few GCYPAA's. In the last couple of years, GCYPAA's conference dates have been in close proximity to other YPAAs in the southeast, as well as ICYPAA. This would give a little space between those, so that out of state attendees won't have to choose between conferences because *not all of us have money like that*. Also, Zone 13-K's annual picnic will likely be held in July. The problem with this date is that it will not work for the campsite and the hotel rates are high for this date range.

- September 13-15 of 2019

- This date would be available if we booked Camp High Harbour. We chose this date for a couple of reasons. We were worried about conflicting dates with Allatoona Round Up (which is usually the second or third weekend in August in Cartersville), so we wanted to avoid that. Also, GSSA is typically the third weekend of September, so it would likely be the weekend before GSSA. We also had to choose a date that would work around Camp High Harbour's summer sessions.

This is one of the hardest requirements to provide with 100% accuracy. We would love to work with advisory and get some suggestions.

YPAA's already scheduled for Summer 2019 (according to YPAA Calendar)

- HACYPAA (Heartland Area Conference) June 7-9, 2019
- ICYPAA typically falls on Labor Day weekend

How will hosting the Conference in Kennesaw serve to carry the message of recovery to alcoholics in need, especially the young person in Georgia?

Over the past several years, Kennesaw, GA has become one of the hotbeds of recovery for young people in Alcoholics Anonymous. In part, this is because of access to large clubhouses in the surrounding areas of Marietta and Woodstock such as Freedom Club and HOW Place. The recent addition of The Zone, an all-pathways recovery center in Marietta, has drawn even more people to recovery in our area.

Moreover, Kennesaw and its nearby locales are home to several Sober Living programs with substantial populations. Hosting the GCYPAA conference here would give those clients access to the message of AA, especially those who are experiencing 12-step recovery for the first time. Another noteworthy consideration is for students studying at Kennesaw State University. KSU is home to one of the nation's largest CRC (Collegiate Recovery Community) Programs, with over 70 students involved. To merge the collegiate experience with the program of Alcoholics Anonymous is, to us, of immense importance.

One challenge posed by the large volume of young people in Kennesaw, Marietta and Woodstock is a lack of unity and cohesion in those areas. While each has strong recovery individually, it has been typical to see clubhouses in each of those areas remain separate from each other. Another challenge we've seen in our areas is the lack of awareness about YPAA conferences on the whole.

Hosting the conference in Kennesaw will finally provide a platform for young people in all of these areas to come together around a common solution, while discovering the capacity for unity, service, and recovery as young people in recovery. It has been shown already, through our bid events, that the young people in Kennesaw are willing and able to be of service and to experience the fellowship of young people in AA. Many of these people who have seen only a glimpse of what young people AA can be could definitely benefit from having a local conference.

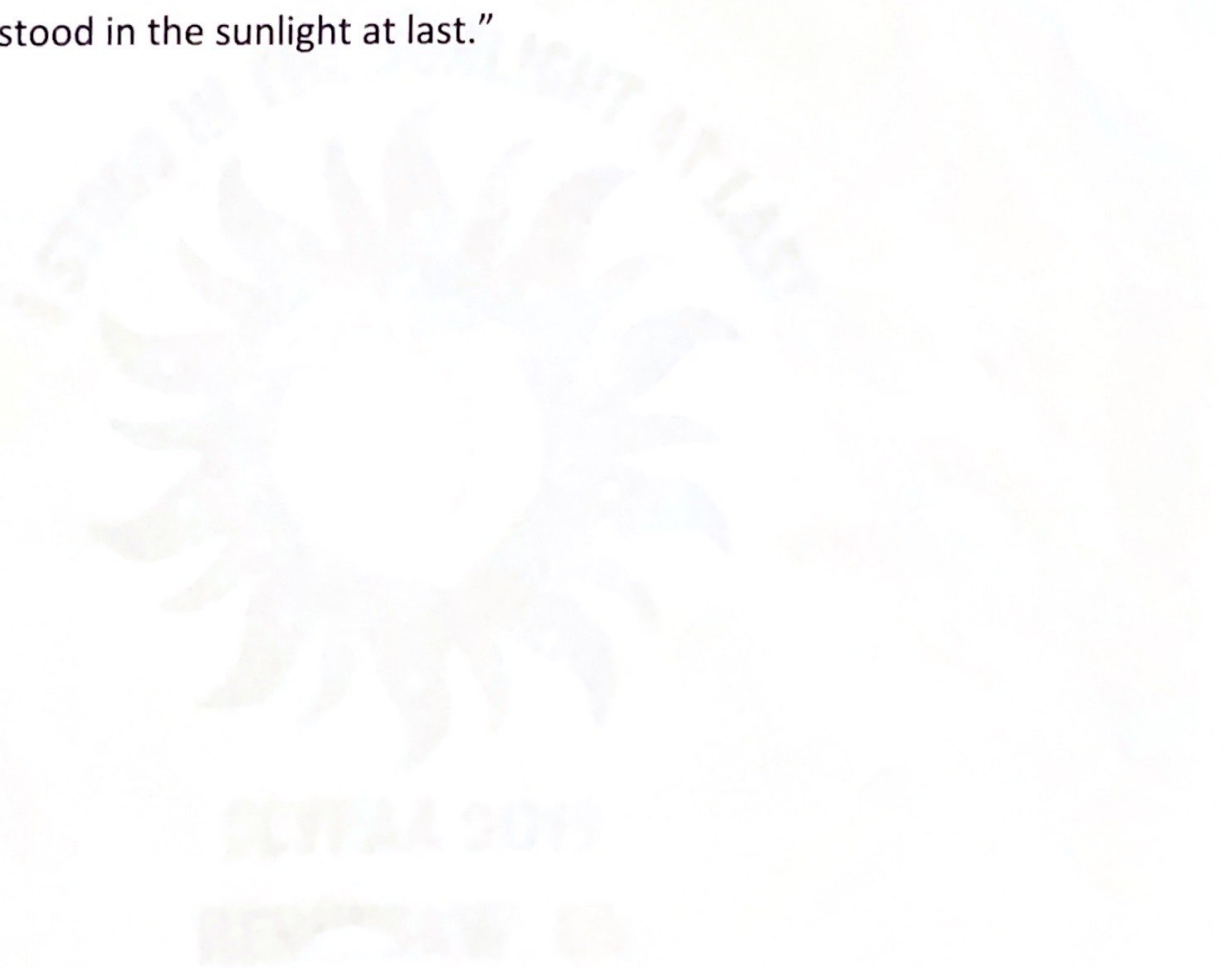
